## Keynote Speaker: Carole Lannon, MD, MPH

Carole Lannon, MD, MPH, is Senior Faculty Lead with the Learning Networks Core at the Cincinnati Children's Anderson Center for Health Systems Excellence and Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Cincinnati. She also serves as the senior quality advisor for the American Board of Pediatrics.

Dr. Lannon works with patients, families, clinicians, and researchers to improve care and outcomes for children and families through the use of the Learning Health Network model.



*"Working with and learning from patients and families to co-produce change strategies has been truly transformative for me. These collaborations have helped dramatically improve our learning health network outcomes. Additionally, improvement science has helped me understand the value of standardization, since the reliability of processes supports a platform for innovation."*

The Learning Health Networks model, used for quality improvement and research, can accelerate population health outcomes and reliably reproduce results at scale. This model has been effective for networks focusing on chronic conditions, rare diseases, safety, and population health. As a result of this work, Dr. Lannon was honored with the 2020 Cincinnati Children's Advocacy Award.

### Joining the Webex Meeting

3. "Click on an image to select the desired virtual background or add your own image by clicking "+" and uploading an image.

### How to Unmute
