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


## Information for In-Person Attendees

#### Location

The designated conference hotel is the Hilton Garden Inn located at 1821 Boren Ave Seattle, WA 98101.

## Parking & Transportation

#### Are you a Seattle Children's Employee?

The downtown campus is extremely well served by public transit and the Westlake Link Light rail station is a short walk from our buildings. As such we encourage all attendees to utilize public transit if possible. We recommend planning your transit route with <u>Google Maps</u> or request personalized commute planning <u>here</u>. If not, please consider carpooling, biking, or another non-drive alone method.

If you must drive and park, parking is available in <u>Building Cure (1920 Terry Ave)</u>. If your typical worksite is downtown, your Children's badge will allow entrance to the parking garage in this building. #### **Are You an External Guest?**

The Seattle Children's Research Institute downtown campus is extremely well served by public transit and the Westlake Link Light rail station is a short walk from our buildings. As such we encourage all attendees to utilize public transit if possible. If not, please consider carpooling, biking, or another non-drive alone method.

If you must drive and park, please park at <u>Seattle Children's Jack R. MacDonald Building (JMB)</u>. The JMB Parking Garage is located on Stewart Street between Ninth and Terry Avenues. When coming southwest on Stewart Street (which is one-way), turn right into the first alley entrance past Terry. Then, turn left into the parking garage entrance (look for a Diamond Parking sign). Pick up a parking ticket, park, and ask the event staff at the registration table for validation. The event will be held one block down Stewart Street at <u>Building Cure (1920 Terry Ave)</u>.

#### **Taking the Light Rail from SeaTac Airport?**

- 1. Get on the 1-Line to Northgate
- 2. Get off at Westlake Station (12 stops)
- 3. From Westlake Station, walk northeast on Pine St toward 5th Ave
- 4. Walk on Pine St towards 6th Ave
- 5. Turn left on 9th Ave
- 6. Turn right onto Stewart St
- 7. The Building Cure "event entrance" is located on Terry Ave between Stewart and Virginia St

## Keynote Speaker: David Hooper, MD, MS

Dr. Hooper has been on faculty in the Division of Nephrology and Hypertension and the James M. Anderson Center for Health Systems Excellence at the University of Cincinnati and Cincinnati Children's Hospital for 12 years. He is Professor of Pediatrics and has been the Medical Director of Kidney Transplantation for 6 years during which time he has led efforts to develop learning healthcare systems for children with a kidney transplant. In 2016, he founded the Improving Renal Outcomes Collaborative (IROC), a learning health network focused on improving health, longevity, and quality of life for children with a kidney transplant. IROC now includes more than half of all children with a kidney transplant



in the United States and has standardized blood pressure management and treatment, has started to improve rejection rates, and houses the world's largest registry of COVID tested pediatric kidney transplant recipients.

# **Guest Speaker: John Bostick**

After 3 years of studying the Learning Health Networks model with Cincinnati Children's Hospital and CincyTech, John Bostick became the founding CEO of Hive Networks. This is John's 5th start-up after an initial 10 years with IBM. John has numerous awards and recognition including the Ohio Valley region's EY Entrepreneur of the Year winner in 2000.

John has also taught publicly the culinary arts with an emphasis on nutrition for 25 years with over 5,000 students and has authored over 500 recipes.
